JUKE BOX JIVE

A special 'Animal Encounters' night was held on Friday 9th October (9pm-midnight) on rock 'n' roll nostalgia show 'Juke Box Jive', hosted by Kerima-Gae. For several weeks prior listeners were asked to nominate a song with an animal in the song's title or artist's name. The Steering Committee will consist of Ross Fear (Chair), Gillian, Leonie Dixon, Roger Brant AIMS:

- 1. To develop the skills. knowledge and understanding in various aspects and issues related to broadcasting for prospective presenters and presenters at Alive 90.5 fm
- **2.** To conduct education and training needs analysis among current presenters.
- **3.** To identify skilled and knowledgeable on-call panel of experts in different aspects of broadcasting
- **4.** To Provide a training schedule for hands on training for prospective presenters at Alive 90.5 fm
- **5.** To provide a program structure for VET in Schools Program for secondary students
- 6. Tο provide community education in broadcasting and media interviewing and media releases for the local community in Greater Western Sydney, especially for media spokespersons of regional community service organisations and community groups.
- **7.** To develop a broadcasting and radio education and training campus for the Greater Western Sydney with affiliation with VET accredited RTO (s) (hopefully CMTO).
- **8.** To conduct accredited Media VET education for community radio (any and all stations) in Greater Western Sydney.

- **9.** To affiliate with other community education organisations and providers for the potential of affiliated education programs for adult education in broadcasting, media use and interviewee skills.
- **10.** To affiliate with VET and Tertiary education institutions teaching media, journalism, communications for tertiary student placements and projects.
- **11.** To develop an associated role in community education broadcasting for the benefit of either targeted community sectors or in general.
